Legislatively appropriated raises for faculty and EPA staff are all merit based, and this year the average raise is 3%. Some modest additional funds were made available to the Colleges (from campus-based tuition increase) to help move tenured/ tenure-track faculty toward the goal of salaries at the 80<sup>th</sup> percentile of our official peers. Thus, for tenured/ tenure-track faculty in the College of Education, a "full merit" raise is defined as 3.5% this year. Raises will appear in the September 30 paycheck, retroactive to July 1.

"Binocular Vision"

Dean Calhoun reviewed the requirements from the NC State Board of Education to "revision" all teacher education programs (initial licensure) and the Master of School Administration program in the 2008-2009. Dr. Vicki Jaus has accepted a two-year assignment (planning, implementation) to guide the College through this effort. A handout of the revisioning roadmap was presented to the College. Dean Calhoun encouraged the College to think about big ideas: an internationalization lens, an urban education lens, joint degree programs or majors/minors that could lead to dual licensure for our candidates, consideration of an earlier start to the professional education sequence. The College was encouraged to use the benefits of binocular vision in this work: see broadly, see deeply, and spot hard-to-see opportunities.
