3. Diversity Committee ~ Greg Wiggan

Revised Diversity Statement – Greg Wiggan brought the revised Diversity Statement before the faculty. The statement is now more inclusive. She explained the changes in the wording, which now reads as gender, gender identity, gender expression which is the language used across campus. 4. Developing Agents of Change: Assessment, edTPA, and Institutional Structures ~ Laura Hart and Charles Hutchison

Issues have been raised on the achievement gaps between candidates of color and white candidates on edTPA in the college. The edTPA team brought this request to the Diversity Committee to form a partnership to explore root causes and develop strategies to address the issue. Faculty broke up into small groups by program to consider the causes of the problem and the action steps.
