3. CMS Panel of Principals and School Leaders, with Dr. Tisha Greene

Acquanetta Edmond, Earnest Winston, Jamie Brooks: Cultural Competence Training in CMS

Acquanetta Edmond, Executive Director for the South Learning Community at CMS, Earnest Winston, Chief Engagement Officer at CMS, and Jamie Brooks, Principal of Community House Middle School spoke about the work being done at CMS on cultural proficiency in teaching practices. The work started by the Office of Diversity and Inclusion back in 2015. They worked with over 40 schools to get Assistant Principals involved to participate in the modules. Community House was the pilot school. They are now culturally responsive teachers and culturally responsive classrooms. It is continuous work. They asked faculty to continue to educate future teachers to have the right tools to be effective when they walk into CMS, the largest urban district. They are still identifying schools to participate. The School Board is also participating. This is ongoing work for the rest of your life. It is intentional to start with leaders who will model the work.
