

Michelle Stephan (MDSK) recently facilitated a series of facilitated book discussions with elementary, middle, and secondary teachers in Kannapolis City Schools about effective mathematics practices.

In April, the **Center for Educational Measurement and Evaluation** (**CEME**) and the **Center for STEM Education (CSTEM**), along with the Mathematics Department at Clemson University, jointly sponsored the first annual UNC Charlotte AP Statistics Practice Examination. Twelve teachers



from York, Gaston, and Mecklenburg counties, and 115 of their students came together for the event. The teachers, under the direction of experienced College Board and ETS consultants **Rich Lambert (CEME, UNC Charlotte)**, Lew Davidson (CMS), Tom Potter (Gaston County Schools) and Bob Taylor (Clemson University), conducted the mock exam.

The University continues to host P-12 teachers on campus for NCDPI Professional Development.

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The **College of Education's Professional Development School (PDS) Network** has supported professional learning to hundreds of teachers and hundreds of UNC Charlotte teacher candidates this year through sustained, formal partnerships with fourteen PDS partners.
